Instruction document on travel safety for incoming staff and students to ZHAW Zurich University of Applied Sciences

1. Travel preparation

- Provide your secretary or a member of your family with a photocopy of your travel plan, passport and credit card numbers and emergency contact details.
- Carry copies of the following documents with you: Passport and visa, tickets, credit card numbers and emergency numbers, contact details of your ZHAW host or the International Office, as well as the local diplomatic mission.

2. Security on site

Police and ambulance telephone numbers should be saved in your mobile phones (find them below).

3. Emergency

- In the event of a robbery, hand over your belongings to the perpetrator without defending yourself (self-protection comes first) and report the incident to the local police immediately.
- After an accident, contact the police and your insurance company.

4. Kidnapping/hostage taking

- Follow the instructions exactly, avoid direct eye contact and do not do anything without first asking the hostage-takers/kidnappers for permission.
- Be alert and be prepared for rescue operations or an escalation of violence.
- If you are questioned, your answers must match the information contained in your papers. Be polite but firm.
- In the event of a rescue operation, stay as close to the ground as possible.
- Follow the instructions of the perpetrators and do not try to resist.
